Core first aid training

- Your arrangements will depend on the outcome of your first-aid needs assessment and the particular circumstances in your workplace at any given time. The findings of the needs assessment should indicate the level of first-aid equipment, facilities and personnel required.

Additional training may be needed for First Aiders to deal with injuries resulting from special hazards.

★★

Where First Aiders are shown to be unnecessary, there is still a possibility of an accident or sudden illness, so you should consider providing qualified First Aiders

The type of injuries that might arise in working with those hazards identified, will influence whether the First Aider should be trained in FAW or EFAW

Category of Risk	Numbers employed at any location	Suggested number of First Aid personnel
Lower	Fewer than 25	At least 1 Appointed Person ★★
e.g. Shops, offices and libraries	25 – 50	At least 1 Emergency First Aider (1-day EFAW)
	More than 50	1 First Aider (FAW) At least one per 100 employees or part thereof
Higher	Fewer than 5	At least 1 Appointed Person ★★
e.g. Light engineering and assembly work, food processing, warehousing, extensive work with dangerous machinery or sharp instruments, construction, chemical manufacture, work involving special hazards ★ such as hydrofluoric acid or confined spaces.	5 – 50	At least 1 First Aider ★★★ (EFAW or FAW)

Workplace first aid:

Level 2 - Emergency first aid at work (EFAW)

- This course is regulated through NUCO training, therefore provides you with an accredited NVQ award in first aid at work
- This comprehensive course covers a wide range of first aid emergencies, enabling all participants to deal with emergency situations with confidence in a prompt, safe and effective way
- 6 hours of practical and theoretical training covering responsibilities; assessment of the situation; first aid hygiene; resuscitation; anatomy; choking; bleeding; shock; epilepsy; minor injuries and dealing with an unresponsive casualty. Compliant with health & safety executive code of practice
- This qualification lasts for 3 years

Level 3 - Safeguarding children, young people or vulnerable adults

- The qualification is designed for learners who have contact with children, young people or vulnerable adults in their working environment including voluntary work.
- It promotes awareness and sensitivity to safeguarding enabling learners to be able to identify issues and emphasises the responsibility to ensure that concerns are reported and acted on appropriately

Level 2 – First aid for Mental health (1 Day)

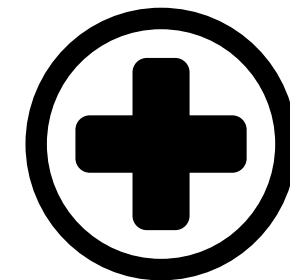

- The qualification is assessed through both a practical and a multiple-choice question paper

CPR, AED and Anaphylaxis – Annual update

Interactive and practical basic life support training which includes: overview of the ABCDE approach; Baby, child and adult choking; Baby, child and adult CPR; Effective use of an AED & Anaphylaxis care guidelines

Mental health first aid – Awareness course (4 hours)

Anyone can be affected by a mental health condition either themselves or a family member, friend or colleague.

This awareness course is suitable for everyone as it provides learners with the knowledge to recognise a suspected mental health condition and the skills to start a conversation and be able to signpost a person towards professional help.

All members of the public can benefit from this course and it is a great stepping stone into First Aid for Mental Health

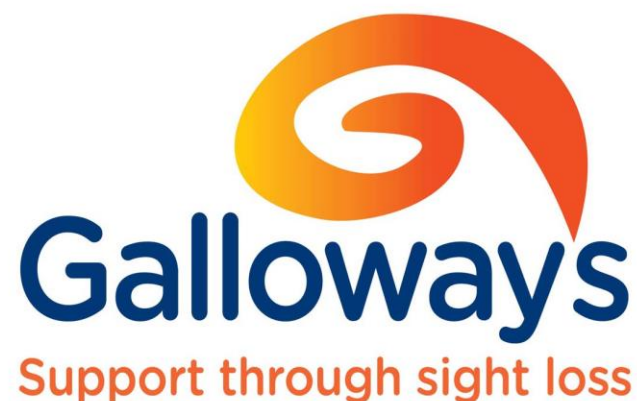

Level 2 - Basic life support (2 hours)

- This Basic Life Support qualification will give learners the skills and knowledge to act in an emergency situation providing the casualty with critical life saving assistance until support arrives.
- The qualification covers cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), the safe use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), primary survey, the recovery position and choking, and is delivered following the protocols set by the Resuscitation Council (UK) Guidelines.
- A learner will gain first aid knowledge and the practical competence required to be able to help someone and potentially save a life.
- £199 per course (12 people), certification costs not included



Mini medics (for children aged 8-16)

- This is a very basic introduction to First Aid for all children and aimed at children between the ages of 8 and 11, but it can suit children of any age.
- First Aid is an important life skill and the course is kept at a basic level with no use of confusing terminologies
- At the very least, the child will be able to make an effective emergency telephone call which may be enough to save someone's life
- 2-3 hours dependent on the syllabus you want covered including educational, theoretical and practical teaching sessions

Defibrillators (AED)

Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) is an 'electrical' problem and occurs when the heart loses its electrical rhythm and suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating. If this happens, blood stops flowing to the brain and other vital organs.

If you find someone unconscious, unresponsive, not breathing or not breathing normally (gaspings), they are in sudden cardiac arrest.

Every minute without effective treatment reduces that person's chance of survival by 10%. If you find someone in sudden cardiac arrest, call 999 immediately and start CPR. If an AED is available, use this straight away. The AED will talk you through the rescue.

If an SCA victim receives defibrillation in the first minute, the victim's chance of survival increases to more than 90 %

Less than one in 10 people survive an out of hospital cardiac arrest in the UK. This is partly because bystanders don't have the skills, equipment or confidence to help. The concern may be that you could do further harm but the irony is without intervention that person has no chance of survival.

If it's not treated, SCA usually causes death within minutes.
